T.C.L view the design of cities and urban areas as a collaborative process, one where urban designers are planning and design facilitators that bring a whole multitude of people and disciplines together to make the outcome a site specific and integrated whole. Kate Cullity's talk will provide insight into T.C.L's site specific and collaborative urban design projects and highlight projects where they have collaborated with Design Flow, an ecological engineering firm with practices in both Adelaide and the Gold Coast. Projects that will be discussed include the Auckland Waterfront, North Terrace and Victoria Square Redevelopments in Adelaide, Sydney University, the Redevelopment of Lonsdale Street and The Australian Garden, both in Victoria.

Kate Cullity is a landscape architect, artist and a founding director of the Landscape Architecture and Urban Design practice Taylor Cullity Lethlean – T.C.L. For some years now T.C.L have been the most nationally awarded practice in Australia, with over 100 awards, including the international 2013 World Architecture Forum Award for the Best Landscape for the Australian Garden, a new botanic garden for the Melbourne Royal Botanic Gardens in Victoria . In 2014 T.C.L were awarded the 8th International Rosa Bara – Barcelona Landscape Architecture Award for the Auckland Waterfront. Kate has particular skills in the integration of public art with landscape and urban design. Her background in botany and her strong personal interest in horticulture have resulted in her involvement in the planting design of sites throughout Australia. She has recently completed a PhD which reflected on 25 years of T.C.L's practice, as well as her interest in beauty, aesthetics and care, and how these qualities can be aligned with creating and appreciating sustainable landscapes and cities. Kate has been a member of the core design team in many of T.C.L's award winning projects including the Redevelopment of North Terrace and Victoria Square in Adelaide and The Australian Garden Stage 1.
